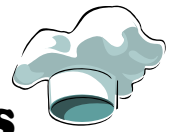


FRISCO FEST

CHEFS' CHOICE COOK OFF OFFICIAL RULES

Sunday, March 7, 2010



The following rules are to be followed by all participants and/or their assistants for the cook off.

1. Each contestant must enter their dish into one of the following categories:
 - a. Soup, Salad, Gumbo or Appetizer
 - b. Meat Entrée (Chicken, Pork or Beef & Wild Game)
 - c. Seafood Entrée
 - d. Dessert
 2. Contestants must supply their own ingredients or secure a sponsor to pay for the ingredients. The contestants will also supply all of their own cooking and serving utensils.
 3. Food may be cooked offsite but should be cooked on Sunday, March 7, 2010. All entries must be complete, delivered to San Francisco Plantation and ready to be served by 11:00 a.m.
 4. Chefs wishing to cook on San Francisco Plantation festival grounds are welcome to do so but no one will be allowed to begin cooking before 6:00 a.m. Cooking booths will be selected on a first come, first served basis.
 5. Any ingredient that accompanies a dish (such as rice or pasta) must be provided by the contestant if applicable. These items may be prepared offsite.
 6. **Each Contestant must cook a recipe that will produce 100 servings.** The food is served in **6 oz taster cups** (which are provided).. The food is considered a donation to the San Francisco Frisco Fest. Please, it's not to be give away to family or friends. The festival committee will provide bowls, knives, forks, spoons and napkins. **The contestant preparing a dessert must serve at least 30 (i.e. slices, cups, pieces, etc.)**
 7. Contestants will be permitted to set up their equipment, decorations, and other facilities anytime after 6:00 a.m. on Sunday, March 7, 2010.
 8. Each contestant will be assigned a contestant's number by the chief scorekeeper and be given containers in which their entry will be collected in time for the official judging. Each contestant should make certain that the number on the bottom of the container is the same as their contestant's number assigned to them by the scorekeeper.
- After samples to be judged have been collected, an announcement will be made to start serving the public at approximately 11:00 a.m.. Contestants or their designees must serve their dish until 1:00 p.m or until their pot is empty.
9. A poster, identifying each chef, their entry and their sponsor shall be placed at each cooking booth.
 10. First, second and third place trophies in each category, a People's Choice trophy and an Overall Judge's Award will be awarded.
